Interview

It's time to hear about one of our second years and the wonders they experience in their internship. This time we'll be talking with Anna Dewenter, a second-year student in the Language and Communication track.

What is your internship about?

We are investigating the semantic control network and its structural decline in mild cognitive impairment and mild dementia. I work with pre-dementia patients, who sometimes show language impairments. We want to know whether problems with semantic control could contribute to these impairments. At the same time, we are assessing potential contributions of the medial temporal lobe in semantic control. We are also acquiring diffusion-weighted data to investigate the role of

two ventral pathways in the semantic control network.

In what lab are you working?

I work in Vitória Piai's language function and dysfunction lab at the DCC, but sometimes I'm also at the medical centre. And we are using the facilities at the DCCN for participant testing. My supervisors are Vitória and Joanna Sierpowska, who is a postdoc and an expert in diffusion-based tractography.

How did you find your internship?

I contacted Vitória only 3 months after I started my Master studies, since I was fascinated by her research. Since then, I attended every lab meeting. We stayed in touch and worked

together on a research idea for my master's project. I would recommend everyone to get in touch early with potential supervisors, since some processes are out of your hands and might take time. I was lucky to be involved in the full research cycle.

What did you have to do for that?

We started with a novel research question. Then, I adapted a behavioral task to assess semantic control and I acquired pilot data. Since we are working with patients, we had to get approval from the local ethical committee. To get this approval, we teamed up with another researcher from the Geriatrics department to collect data. We also share some of the neuropsychological tests to make the testing as easy as possible for our patients. In the meantime, I presented our study at the DCCN's PPM, pre-registered our study and set up the study protocol together with a Bachelor of honor's student from our lab and other students from the RadboudUMC.

How do you combine other courses and your internship?

I took most of my courses in my first year to be maximally flexible for patient testing. This makes it a lot easier to find spots at the scanners, which still remains a challenge.

How is your relationship with your supervisor?

My supervisor is amazing: brilliant, supportive, but at the same time lets room for my own ideas and development. We met very frequently in the beginning of the project, but for now schedule meetings when we need to discuss the next steps. I can always knock on her and other lab member's doors to seek help. I really like the team work in our lab!

And finally, what do you want to do when you're done with CNS?

I would like to pursue a PhD, and ideally I will work with patients again.

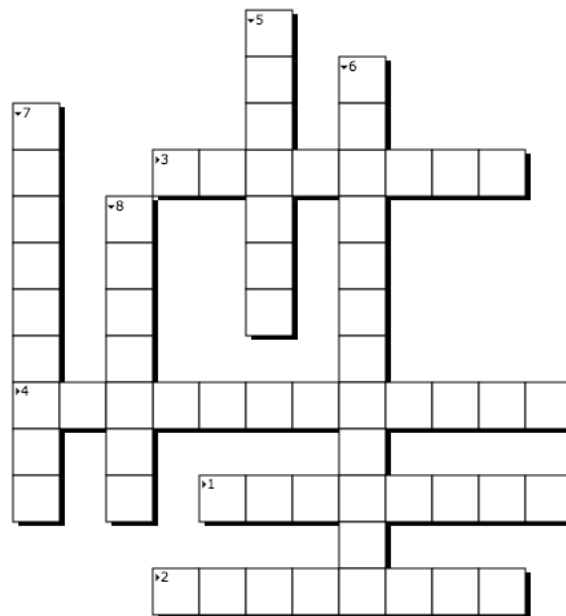
