This wanna-be philosopher cannot stop asking stupid questions no one has an answer to. Rowan prides himself of being CogNito's treasurer, even without money.



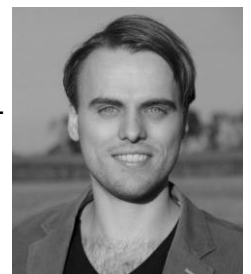
Tineke Banda:
